²⁴[Jesus said:] “No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.

²⁵“Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? ²⁸And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ³⁰But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? ³¹Therefore do not be anxious, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ ³²For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. ³³But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

Trinity Lutheran Church : Missouri Synod's Communion Statement



It is the duty of every Christian to examine themselves before coming to communion.
Therefore, please read and affirm the following to yourself before reception:

1. "The true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ is under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink."
2. "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins' show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are given through these words... whoever believes in these words has exactly what they say."
3. "As Christians partake of this sacrament together, they make a solemn public confession of Christ and of unity in the truth of His Gospel."


